More than 3,000 South Carolina middle-aged adults with special needs are living at home with aging parents or caregivers. Elderly, often frail parents have the double responsibility of caring for themselves and their adult child.

Their fears are genuine and often acute: Where will my loved one live when I am no longer able to provide care? Will my child be in a loving, nurturing place? Why are there not enough residential options in South Carolina?



In 2003, a group of parents took these concerns to the South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. As a result, Aldersgate Special Needs was formed as a ministry of the Conference to confront the critical shortage of community and faith-based residences.

Our Ministry is Growing

Aldersgate has chipped away at the need, but much remains to be achieved. Many South Carolinians are desperately waiting for an opening in a loving, caring, non-institutionalized home. Today, Aldersgate Special Needs Ministry operates six single-gender group homes throughout the Conference. We have the capacity to grow, and more homes are urgently needed.
